COURSES FULFILLING CORE REQUIREMENTS OF BOARD OF REGENTS AND UL LAFAYETTE

The following table is meant to give guidance to faculty and students regarding the UL Lafayette courses that satisfy the core education requirements of both the Board of Regents and the University. Please note that a given curriculum may and often does specify a particular course or courses to fulfill a core requirement. This table indicates all the courses that can potentially satisfy a given requirement, and does not dictate policy or practice at the college or department level.
