- 7. Cost of attendance figures for determining financial aid awards will be calculated by the UL Lafayette Financial Aid Office using cost and attendance information provided by the Universidad de Cantabria and the UL Lafayette College of Liberal Arts.

8. Enrollment Status:

a. The UL Lafayette College of Liberal Arts will provide the UL Lafayette Department of Financial Aid with the UL Lafayette Request for Approval of Transfer of Credit Form on each student requiring financial assistance.
